**Daniel C. Schultz**  
**Vice President & General Manager**  
**Ship & Aviation Systems**



Daniel (Dan) C. Schultz serves as vice president and general manager of Lockheed Martin's Mission Systems and Sensors (MS2) Ship & Aviation Systems (SAS) line of business.

Mr. Schultz is an experienced technology business leader with a proven record of leading organizations through meaningful change. In his current position, he is responsible for all strategic and execution activities for all SAS programs, including the Littoral Combat Ship; Coast Guard systems; aviation systems, including rotary wing, fixed wing and unmanned aerial vehicles; surveillance systems; electronic products and logistics; and launcher and weapon systems. Mr. Schultz is also responsible for the general management of all 21 SAS sites with more than 3,000 employees.

Mr. Schultz began his Lockheed Martin career in 2006. Over the past 3 years, he has provided an environment of innovation and entrepreneurship for employees, leading Lockheed Martin's effort to build the nation's first Littoral Combat Ship, USS Freedom (LCS 1), which was delivered to the U.S. Navy in September 2008 and will be deployed this year, two years ahead of schedule. In addition, Mr. Schultz supported the acquisition of Aculight Corporation, allowing SAS to venture into the lasers and sensors market.

Mr. Schultz came to Lockheed Martin from Raytheon Technical Services Company, where he served as senior vice president and general manager of the company's largest business unit. Mr. Schultz received the CEO Award for Business Excellence, one of Raytheon's highest honors, in 2005.

While on active duty in the Marine Corps, Mr. Schultz was the program manager for the multi-billion dollar Joint V- 22 Osprey Program. He managed more than 2,000 government and contract employees in 10 geographic locations and was accountable for the execution of the program for the Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps and Special Operations Command. He was responsible for bringing the OSPREY to full rate production.

Mr. Schultz's career includes serving as the deputy to the Deputy Assistant Secretary of Navy Research, Development and Acquisition. He also served on the Joint Chiefs of Staff, J-8 Joint Requirements Oversight Council, (JROC), as Commanding Officer Marine Heavy Helicopter Squadron 461, and commanding officer Headquarters and Service Battalion 2nd SRIG.

Mr. Schultz received a Bachelor of Science degree in chemistry from the Virginia Military Institute and a Master of Science degree in national resource strategy from the National Defense University. He is a graduate of the Defense System Program Management Course, the Senior Acquisition Course, DOD Executive Acquisition Course, and is Level III certified in Program Management. He is also the recipient of the American Helicopter Society (AHS) Frederick Feinberg Award for courage in Aviation.
